The following Act of the Andhra Pradesh Legislature received the assent of the Governor on the 24th January, 2013 and the said assent is hereby first published on the 24th January, 2013 in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette for general information.

ACT. NO. 1 OF 2013

AN ACT. ANDHRA PRADESH SCHEDULED CASTES SUB-PLAN AND TRIBAL SUB-PLAN (PLANNING, ALLOCATION AND UTILISATION OF FINANCIAL RESOURCES) ACT, 2013

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ANDHRA PRADESH SCHEDULED CASTES SUB-PLAN AND TRIBAL SUB-PLAN (PLANNING, ALLOCATION AND UTILISATION OF FINANCIAL RESOURCES) ACT, 2013.

An Act to ensure, accelerated development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes with emphasis on achieving equality in the next ten years focusing on economic, educational and human development along with ensuring the security and social dignity and promoting equity among Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, by earmarking a portion, in proportion to population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the State, of the total plan outlay of the State of Andhra Pradesh as the outlay of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan of the State and ensuring effective institutional mechanisms for the implementation and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Andhra Pradesh in the Sixty-third year of the Republic of India as follows:

CHAPTER – I

- 1.(1) This Act may be called the Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan (Planning, Allocation and **Preliminary Short title, extent, commencement,**

Utilization of Financial Resources) Act, 2013.

duration and savings.

- (2) It extends to the whole of the State of Andhra Pradesh.
- (3) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette, appoint, and different dates may be appointed for different provisions of this Act.
- (4) It shall cease to have effect after the expiry of ten years from the date of commencement, except in respect of this done or omitted to be done before such cesser and upon such cesser the Andhra Pradesh General Clauses Act, 1891, shall apply as if this Act had been repealed by a State Act.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-

Definitions

- (a) **"The Department"** means any Government Department concerned with implementation of the plan schemes for the welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes;
- (b) **"Gaps in development"** means differences in development indicators of Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes when compared to the state averages, as may be prescribed particularly relating to human and economic development;
- (c) **"General Schemes"** means schemes included in the Annual Plans of the Departments which benefit all social groups including Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes;
- (d) **"Government"** means the State Government of Andhra Pradesh;
- (e) **"Nodal Agency for SCSP"** means the committee headed by Minister of Social Welfare;
- (f) **"Nodal Agency for TSP"** means the committee headed by Minister of Tribal Welfare;
- (g) **"Nodal Department"** means Social Welfare Department for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Welfare Department for Tribal Sub-Plan;
- (h) **"Notification"** means notification published in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette and the word 'Notified' shall be construed accordingly;
- (i) **"Prescribed"** means prescribed by the Government by rules made under the Act;

- (j) **“State Council”** means State Council for Development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes constituted under the Act;
- (k) **“Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes”** shall have the meanings assigned respectively under clauses (24) and (25) of article 366 of the Constitution of India;
- (l) **“Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP)”** means the Plan approved by the State Council for inclusion in the Annual Plan of the Department to bridge the gap in development of Scheduled Castes and shall include the SC component of general schemes;
- (m) **“Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP)”** means the Plan approved by the State Council for inclusion in the Annual Plan of the Department to bridge the gap in development of Scheduled Tribes and shall include the ST component of general schemes;
- (n) **“Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan Fund”** means a portion of the total plan outlays of the State, in a financial year, as earmarked under the section 3;
- (o) **“Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan Schemes”** means the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/ Tribal Sub-Plan schemes included in the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan of the Departments
- (p) **“Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribe habitation”** means any habitation where population of Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes or combined population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes is not less than 40% of the total population of the habitation;
- (q) **“Sub-Plans”** means Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP) or Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) or both;
- (r) **“Scheduled Areas”** means areas notified under Part C of Fifth Schedule to Constitution of India;
- (s) **“Report regarding administration of Scheduled Areas”** means the Report by the Governor to the President of India regarding administration of Scheduled Areas as mentioned in paragraph 3 of Part A of Fifth Schedule to Constitution of India;
- (t) **“A.P. Tribes Advisory Council”** means the Tribes Advisory Council as mentioned in paragraph 4 of Part B of Fifth Schedule to Constitution of India.”

CHAPTER - II

PLANNING, RESOURCE ALLOCATION FOR SCHEDULED CASTES SUB-PLAN AND TRIBAL SUB-PLAN FUNDS AND SCHEMES

3. The State shall, in every financial year, earmark in such manner as may be prescribed, a portion of the total Plan outlays of the State which shall be proportionate to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribe population of the State, to be called as Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan Fund:

Earmarking of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan Fund from Plan outlays.

Provided that, the Fund to be earmarked is determined at least 6 months prior to commencement of the next financial year:

Provided further that, the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan Fund outlay shall be revised according to State Annual Plan final outlay and:

Provided also that the expenditure of the SCSP/TSP Fund shall be accounted for in the manner hereafter specified in this Act.

4. The department as may be authorized by the Government shall, every financial year, communicate, in the manner prescribed, to the other departments, a tentative plan outlay out of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/ Tribal Sub-Plan Fund as earmarked under Section 3 for preparation of respective department wise Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan.

Communication of Plan outlay earmarked as Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan Fund to the departments

5. The Sub-Plans of the departments shall include only such schemes that secure direct and quantifiable benefits to the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe individuals or Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe households or Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe habitations or Tribal areas and that have the potential to bridge the gaps in development following the norms laid down in this Act and the rules made there under:

Schemes to be included under the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plans and Tribal Sub-Plans.

Provided that the schemes should be consistent with the Annual and Five Year Plans and priorities of the State of Andhra Pradesh as may be communicated by the Planning department.

6. The departments shall prepare Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan to promote equity in the development among various social groups within Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and focused development of backward Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribe habitations. In case of Tribal Sub-Plan, special attention shall be paid to Scheduled Tribes residing in the Scheduled Areas.

Promotion of equity among Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

7. The departments shall ensure coverage of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes in the ongoing general schemes consistent with their eligibility for the same.

Obligation to cover Scheduled Castes/Sch. Tribes in general Schemes

8. On receipt of communication under section 4, each department, shall, after estimating the gaps in the development of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, prioritize the development needs of Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes through a consultative process, as may be prescribed and shall formulate the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan schemes and prepare the Sub-Plans comprising of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/ Tribal Sub-Plan schemes, within the State Plan priorities as communicated under section 5.

Formulation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan schemes and preparation of Sub-Plans by the departments.

9. Each Department, excluding the departments separately notified under this Act, shall submit each year, to the respective Nodal Departments, the Sub-Plans comprising of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan Schemes proposed to be included in the Annual Plans, for appraisal by the Nodal Agency concerned, within the time frame and in the format, as may be prescribed.

Submission of Sub-Plan proposed to be included in the Annual Plan for appraisal.

CHAPTER-III

APPRAISAL, ALLOCATION OF SCHEDULED CASES SUB-PLAN/TRIBAL SUB-PLAN FUND AND APPROVAL OF THE SUB-PLANS

10. The Nodal Agency for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/ Tribal Sub-Plan, shall take up appraisal of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan schemes and Tribal Sub-Plan schemes respectively submitted by departments, to ensure conformity with the conditions and norms laid down in the

Appraisal of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan Schemes by the Nodal

Act.

11. The respective Nodal Agency, while indicating allocation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan Fund and Tribal Sub-Plan Fund to the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan schemes shall follow the following norms namely;-

- (a) For schemes exclusively benefiting Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe individuals or Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe households, 100% of scheme cost shall be allocated and accounted for under Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan fund.
- (b) For schemes benefiting Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe habitations, 100% of scheme cost shall be allocated and accounted for under Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan fund in case of other habitations the cost shall be allocated and accounted for under Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan in proportion of the population of the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes;
- (c) For general schemes, included in the Sub-Plans, benefiting Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe individuals or Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe households, along with others, the scheme cost shall be allocated and accounted for under Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan, in proportion to the Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe beneficiaries covered;
- (d) In respect of non-divisible infrastructure works a portion of the scheme cost as may be determined by the Government shall be deemed to have been attributed for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan respectively.

12. The schemes that fulfill the norms laid down in the Act shall be recommended by Nodal Agency for Social Welfare and Nodal Agency for Tribal Welfare for inclusion in the Annual Plan proposals of the

Agencies.

Allocation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan Fund and Tribal Sub-Plan Fund for financing the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan schemes included in the Sub-Plan.

Recommendation by the Nodal Agencies and Nodal Department.

CHAPTER-IV

BUDGET PROVISIONING DISTRIBUTION AND STRENGTHENING OF IMPLEMENTATION MACHINERY

13. The budget approved by the State Council for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan shall be included in the Demands for Grants for the departments under the relevant head of account for the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan. **Budget allocations.**

14. There shall be an exclusive Secretary, Finance in Finance Department for performing the functions relating to Budget implementation and allocation according to the provisions of this Act within the overall discipline of the ways and means positions as determined by the Finance department. **Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan wing in Finance Department**

15. Budget Release Orders shall be issued to each department, for the amount provided in the Budget Estimates for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan immediately after passing of the budget by the State Legislature in accordance with the schedule and norms prescribed. **Budget Release Orders.**

CHAPTER – V

INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENTS

16. (1) As soon as may be, after the commencement of this Act, the Government shall, by notification, constitute a Council under the Chief Minister, to be known as the State Council for Development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes to exercise the powers conferred and to perform the functions assigned to it under the Act and the rules made thereunder. **State Council for Development of Schedule Castes/ Scheduled Tribes.**

(2) The State council shall meet at least twice in a year.

17. The State Council shall:-

Functions of the State Council.

- (a) Advise the State Government on all the policy matters relating to Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan;
- (b) Suggest measures for proper planning and implementation of the schemes by the departments;
- (c) Approve the Annual Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan proposals of the Departments;
- (d) Perform such other functions as may be prescribed.

18. (1) Nodal Agencies headed by Ministers of Social Welfare and Tribal Welfare, shall be constituted in the manner prescribed, for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan respectively and shall exercise the powers conferred and perform the functions assigned under this act.

Nodal agency and Nodal Department.

(2) The Social Welfare Department and Tribal Welfare Department shall act as Nodal Departments for assisting the respective Nodal Agency to perform its functions and exercise its powers.

19. The respective Nodal Agency with the assistance of the respective Nodal Department shall:-

Functions of Nodal Agency and Nodal Department.

- (1) Evaluate and appraise Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/ Tribal Sub-Plan proposed by the departments for ensuring conformity to the provisions of this Act;
- (2) Prepare State Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan for placing before the State Council for Development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes for consideration and approval;
- (3) Recommend reallocation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan funds from a department to other department;
- (4) Review the implementation and monitoring of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan programme;
- (5) Identify impediments and suggest measures for overcoming

the impediments;

- (6) Co-ordinate with the departments for preparation of State Level and district level Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/ Tribal Sub-Plan;
- (7) Maintain transparency in expenditure; maintain scheme wise; district wise, village wise and beneficiary wise details as may be prescribed; set up a web portal for tracking the progress of the implementation, expenditure, output and outcome indicators as may be prescribed of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan;
- (8) Facilitate at least annual social auditing of expenditure of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan funds and facilitate analysis of improvement in Human Development Index against the projections for the State and district:

Provided that the directions of the Nodal Agency shall be binding on the Departments.

20. The Government shall appropriately strengthen the Nodal Departments of Social Welfare and Tribal Welfare with an Administrative and Technical Support Unit and a Sub-Plan Research Centre as may be prescribed, to perform the functions and discharge the duties assigned to it and to assist the respective Nodal Agency.

Administrative and technical support to Nodal Department for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/TSP

21. The departments as identified by the State Council may establish a Sub-Plan Support Unit, as may be prescribed to manage the respective Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan.

Department level Sub-Plan Support Unit.

22. (1) The Government shall constitute a District Monitoring Committee in each district with the District Collector as its Chairman, which shall be responsible for implementation of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan in the district.

Unimplementation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/ Tribal Sub-Plan schemes in the districts.

(2) The District Planning Committees of each district shall review the implementation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan periodically.

23. The respective departments of Government shall take such measures as may be necessary for institutional strengthening of State, District and Sub-District units by providing necessary guidelines, staff and training to the staff in the manner prescribed, for effective implementation and monitoring.

Institutional strengthening for effective implementation and monitoring.

CHAPTER-VI

TRANSPARENCY AND ACCOUNTABILITY IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SCHEDULED CASTES SUB-PLAN/TRIBAL SUB-PLAN

24. (1) Each department shall ensure transparency and accountability at all levels in the implementation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan schemes.

Transparency and accountability.

(2) Each department shall, host the documents, as may be prescribed in public domain.

25. Government shall formulate and appropriate scheme, to award incentives for commendable performance and disincentives for proven negligence and lack of due diligence, in discharge of responsibilities under this Act by any functionary or official concerned:

Incentives and penalties.

Provided that disciplinary action shall be governed by the relevant service/disciplinary rules applicable to the Government officials and functionaries.

26. The Nodal agency shall place before the State Legislature, an Annual Report on outcome of implementation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan containing department-wise achievements and the un-utilized funds during the financial year under report. The report on TSP to the extent of scheduled areas shall form part of the Report regarding the administration of scheduled areas to be submitted to Governor in consultation with A.P. Tribes Advisory Council.

Annual Report to be placed before State Legislature.

27. (1) Subject to the other provisions of this Act. The Government may, by notification, make rules for carrying out all or any of the purposes of this Act.

Power to make Rules.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:

- (a) Determination of gaps in development of Scheduled Castes and Schedule Tribes under section 2;
- (b) Earmarking Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan Funds from the plan outlays under section 3;
- (c) Identification of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan Schemes and preparation of Sub-Plans by the departments under section 8;
- (d) Preparation of budget proposal of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan for appraisal by the Nodal Departments under section 9;
- (e) Strengthen the Finance Department for monitoring expenditures under the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan under section 14;
- (f) Constitution of, and transaction of business in the State Council for development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes; the qualification, disqualification and other allowances to the non-official members of the State Council under section 16;
- (g) Constitution of Nodal Agencies for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan under section 18;
- (h) Maintenance of a web portal by the Nodal Agency under section 19;
- (i) Constitution of Administrative and Technical Support Unit in respective Nodal Department for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan/Tribal Sub-Plan under section 20;
- (j) Constitution of Sub-Plan Support Unit at department level under section 21;
- (k) Constitution of District Monitoring Committees and the connected matters under section 22;
- (l) Institutional strengthening at State, district and sub-district level for ensuring effective implementation, awareness, mass contact programme, social audit and monitoring of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan under section 23; and
- (m) Procedures for ensuring transparency and accountability in the implementation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan under section 24.

(3) Every rule made under this Act shall, immediately after it is made, be laid before the Legislature of the State, if it is in session and if it is not in session, in the session immediately following for a total period of fourteen days which may be comprised in one session or in two successive sessions and if, before the expiration of the session in which it is so laid or the session immediately following the Legislature agrees in making any modification in the rule or in the annulment of the rule, the rule shall, from the date on which the modification or annulment is notified, have effect only in such modified form or shall stand annulled as the case may be so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.

28. (1) If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of the Act, the Government may, by order, make such provisions or give such directions not inconsistent with the provisions of the Act as may appear to it to be necessary or expedient for the removal of the difficulty: **Power to remove difficulties.**

Provided that no such power shall be exercised after the expiry of a period of two years from the commencement of this Act.

(2) Every order made under this section shall be laid, as soon as it is made, before each House of the State Legislature.

ORDER:

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has enacted “The Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan (Planning, Allocation and Utilization of Financial Resources) Act, 2013”. (Act No.1 of 2013) (herein after referred to as Act).

2. The Act is to ensure, accelerated development of Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) with emphasis on achieving equality in the next ten years focusing on economic, educational and human development along with ensuring security social dignity and promoting equity among Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, by earmarking a portion, in proportion to the population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the State, of the total plan outlay of the State of Andhra Pradesh as the outlay of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP)/Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) of the State.

3. The Act also envisages setting up of a Nodal Agency for Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) and to establish an Administrative and Technical Support Unit to strengthen the Nodal Department for TSP.

4. In exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 18 to 20 of the said Act No. 1 of 2013, the Government of Andhra Pradesh, hereby orders constituting the “Nodal Agency for Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) with the following composition and functions for matters relating to Tribal Sub-Plan(TSP).

5. The composition of the Nodal Agency for Tribal Sub-Plan(TSP) shall be as follows:

Special Invitee - The Nodal Agency may invite any person as deemed necessary as Special Invitee to its meetings.

6. The Nodal Agency shall carry out the following functions:

I. Appraisal of Schemes submitted by Departments - The Nodal Agency for TSP shall appraise the Tribal Sub-Plan Schemes submitted by departments, for ensuring conformity to the provisions of the Act namely

A. The schemes proposed should secure direct and quantifiable benefits to the Scheduled Tribes individuals or Scheduled Tribes households or Scheduled Tribes habitations. The Nodal Agency, while indicating allocation of Tribal Sub-Plan Fund to the Tribal Sub-Plan schemes shall follow the norms, namely:

- i. for schemes exclusively benefiting Scheduled Tribe individuals or Scheduled Tribe households, 100% of scheme cost shall be allocated and accounted for under Tribal Sub-Plan fund;
- ii. For schemes benefiting Scheduled Tribe habitations, 100% of scheme cost shall be allocated and accounted for under Tribal Sub-Plan fund. In case of

other habitations the cost shall be allocated and accounted for under Tribal Sub-Plan in proportion to the population of the Scheduled Tribes;

- iii. for general schemes, included in the Sub-Plans, benefiting Scheduled Tribe individuals or Scheduled Tribe households, along with others, the scheme cost shall be allocated and accounted for under Tribal Sub-Plan, in proportion to the Scheduled Tribe beneficiaries covered or the actual amounts spent on Scheduled Tribes;
- iv. in respect to non-divisible infrastructure works a portion of the scheme cost as may be determined by the Government shall be deemed to have been attributed for Tribal Sub-Plan;

B. The schemes proposed should have the potential to bridge gaps in development;

C. The schemes under TSP should be consistent with the Annual and Five Year Plans and priorities of the State of Andhra Pradesh as may be communicated by the Planning Department. The Nodal Agency should therefore as far as possible ensure that Tribal Sub-Plan allocation are met within each sector of the Plan individually;

D. The schemes should promote equity in development among various social groups within Scheduled Tribes and focused development of backward Scheduled Tribes habitations. Special attention shall be paid to Scheduled Tribes residing in the Scheduled Areas;

E. The Nodal Agency should ensure at least 1/3 rd of the ST Plan outlay is devoted to capital expenditure debitible to the Head of Account 4000 onwards.

II. **Preparation and Recommendation of TSP** - The schemes that fulfill the norms as laid down in the Act, shall be recommended by the Nodal Agency for TSP for inclusion in the Annual Plan proposals of the departments and aggregated for placing before the State Council for Development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes through the Planning Department, for consideration and approval as pre-budget process.

III. **Reallocation**- The Nodal Agency shall recommend re-allocation of budget allotted from departments, which are not in a position to incur expenditure, to other needy departments or as may be necessary to ensure expenditure of funds allocated under the TSP.

IV. **Review and Monitoring** - The Nodal Agency shall review and monitor the allocation, expenditure and implementation of TSP.

V. **Identify and Overcome Impediments** - The Nodal Agency shall identify impediments and suggest measures for overcoming them to ensure that all departments spend the funds earmarked for TSP.

VI. **Coordination** - The Nodal Agency shall co-ordinate with the departments the preparation of State Level and District Level Tribal Sub-Plan.

- VII. **Transparency and Accountability** – The Nodal Agency shall cause the maintenance of scheme wise, district wise, village wise and beneficiary wise details and through the Nodal department set up a web portal for tracking the progress of the implementation, expenditure, output and outcome indicators as may be prescribed in Tribal Sub-Plan.
- VIII. **Facilitating Social Audit**: The Nodal Agency shall facilitate at least annual social auditing of expenditure of Tribal Sub-Plan and facilitate analysis of improvement in Human Development Index against the projections for the State and district.
- IX. **Annual Report**- The Nodal Agency shall authorize the Nodal department to place before the State Legislature, an Annual Report on outcome of implementation of Tribal Sub-Plan containing department-wise achievements and the un-utilized funds during the financial year under report. The report on TSP to the extent of scheduled areas shall form part of the Report regarding the administration of scheduled areas to be submitted to Governor in consultation with A.P. Tribes Advisory Council.
- X. Any other function as may be assigned by the government from time to time.
7. The directions of the Nodal Agency in the implementation of its functions shall be binding on the department.
8. The Nodal Agency shall meet at least once in two months or as frequently as necessary.
9. The Tribal Welfare Department shall act as the Nodal Department for assisting the Nodal Agency for TSP to perform its functions. The Tribal Welfare Department as Nodal Department shall constitute an Administrative and Technical Support Unit for assisting it in performing functions and discharge duties assigned to it in assisting the Nodal Agency for TSP.
10. The Tribal Department shall establish a Sub-Plan Research Center at Center for Economic and Social Studies, Hyderabad (CESS) to carry out studies and gap analysis for identifying priority areas of investment under the TSP.
11. The Tribal Department shall also establish GIS and MIS Cells with requisite technical staff to assist it in planning and monitoring the TSP.
12. All the related departments in the address entry are requested to prepare the TSP for approval by the Nodal Agency and implement the TSP as per the directions of the Nodal Agency for TSP.

ORDER:

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has enacted "The Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan (Planning, Allocation and Utilization of Financial Resources) Act, 2013". (Act No. 1 of 2013) (herein after referred to as Act).

2. The Act is to ensure, accelerated development of Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs) with emphasis on achieving equality in the next ten years focusing on economic, educational and human development along with ensuring security social dignity and promoting equity among Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, by earmarking a portion, in proportion to the population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the State, of the total plan outlay of the State of Andhra Pradesh as the outlay of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP)/Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) of the State.

3. The Act envisages that schemes included in SCSP/TSP should secure direct and quantifiable benefits to SC/ST individual or SC/ST house-holds or SC/ST habitations and should bridge the gaps in development indicators between SCs/STs, when compared to state averages.

4. The Act also envisages that in respect of non-divisible infrastructure works, a portion of the scheme cost as may be determined by the Government shall be deemed to have been attributed for SCSP and TSP respectively.

5. As per the latest available estimates of Census of India 2001, the SC population in the State of Andhra Pradesh is 16.2% and ST population is 6.6%. In case of nondivisible infrastructure works such as irrigation, energy, transport, education and health infrastructure projects, which are equally critical to promote economic and human development among SCs & STs, the current practice is to account 16.2% under SCSP and

6.6% under TSP keeping in view of the difficulty in allocation and attribution to SC/ST individual/household/habitation.

6. The Government after careful examination of the matter, hereby orders the following:

a. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Act, 16.2% of the total State Annual Plan Outlay for the Financial year 2013-14, shall be allocated to finance Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP) Fund and 6.6% of the total State Annual Plan Outlay for the Financial year 2013-14, be allocated to finance Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) Fund based on the Population Census, 2001.

b. In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 11(d) of the Act, in case of non-divisible infrastructure works 7.0% for SCs and 3.0% for STs of the scheme cost shall be accounted in the allocation and expenditure of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP) and Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) Funds respectively. The balance amount of SCSP/TSP would be required to be spent in terms of Sections 11(a) to 11(c) of the Act, so as to secure quantifiable benefits to SCs/STs as per the directions of the Nodal Agency.

7. The Nodal Agency for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP), the Nodal Agency for Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) and all the Departments of Secretariat and Heads of Departments are therefore, requested to take action accordingly for formulation of Plan Schemes and Budget Estimates for the Financial year 2013-14.

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ORDER:

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has enacted "The Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan (Planning, Allocation and Utilization of Financial Resources) Act, 2013". (Act No.1 of 2013) (herein after referred as Act).

2. The Act is to ensure, accelerated development of Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) with emphasis on achieving equality in the next ten years focusing on economic, educational and human development along with ensuring security social dignity and promoting equity among Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, by earmarking a portion, in proportion to population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the State, of the total plan outlay of the State of Andhra Pradesh as the outlay of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP) / Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) of the State. The Act also envisages setting up of a State Council for Development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes to advise on policy matters related to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, suggest measures for planning and implementation of schemes and for approving the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP)/Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) of the departments.

3(a). In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 16 of the Act, the Government of Andhra Pradesh, hereby orders constituting the "**State Council for Development of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes**" (hereinafter referred to as the State Council), with the following composition and functions for matters relating to Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP) and Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP).

3(b). Special Invitees - The State Council may invite any person as deemed necessary as Special Invitee.

3(c). Terms of office and allowances of Non-Official Members of State Council - Non-Official Members of the State Council will hold office for one term of two years only. They shall receive fees and allowances as prescribed by the Government from time to time.

3(d). Meetings of the State Council - The State Council shall meet at least twice in a year.

4. Functions - The State Council shall,

- a) advise State Government on all the policy matters relating to Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan /Tribal Sub-Plan;
- b) suggest measures for proper planning and implementation of schemes by the departments;
- c) approve the Annual Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan /Tribal Sub-Plan proposals of the Departments;
- d) Perform such other functions as may be prescribed and are necessary for implementation for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan.

5. The Annual SCSP/TSP Plan as approved by the State council shall be deemed to have been accorded financial concurrence by the Finance Department under the respective SCSP/TSP Budgetary provision for that year. The respective Departments will take steps to issue administrative approval within 10 days of receipt of State Council approval following usual procedures.

6. Planning Department shall assist the State Council in discharge of its functions and coordination with the respective Nodal Agencies / Nodal Departments.

2. In order to achieve the objectives envisaged in the Act, State Council for Development of SCs and STs is constituted Vide G.O. 2nd read above. The State Council advises the Government on all policy matters relating to SCs Sub-Plan / Tribal Sub Plan, suggest measures for proper planning and implementation of schemes, approve to Annual SC Sub Plan / Tribal Sub Plan proposals and performs such functions as prescribed and for implementation of SC/ST Sub-Plan.

3. The important functions of the Council is the approval of Annual SCSP / TSP Plan. Once SCSP / TSP Plan as approved by the Council, it shall be deemed to have accorded financial concurrence by the Finance Department., under the SCSP / TSP Budgetary Provisions for the years. The budget approved by the State Council for SCs Sub Plan / TSP shall be provided in the Annual Budget. The respective Departments will issue administrative sanction within 10 days of receipt of State Council approval, following usual procedures.

4. Section 14, of the Act envisages nomination of an exclusive Secretary, Finance in Finance Department for performing the functions relating to Budget implementation and allocation according to the provisions of this Act within the overall discipline of the ways

and means position as determined by the Finance Department. Section 15 of the act envisages that Budget Release Orders shall be issued to each department, for the amount provided in the Budget Estimates for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan / Tribal Sub-plan immediately after passing of the budget by the state Legislature in accordance with the schedule and norms prescribed.

5. Accordingly Principal Secretary to Government (FP), Finance Department is nominated as the exclusive Secretary, Finance for performing functions relating to Budget implementation and allocation within the overall ways and means position of the State.

Tribal Empowerment Policy 2010 – 2015

The Govt. of Andhra Pradesh has been in the forefront in Tribal development in the Country. Many initiatives brought out by the State like Single Line Administration system, Ashram Schools, Residential Schools, 100% reservation to the local tribals in employment have been widely commended and replicated elsewhere. Owing to these initiatives, the socio economic development of the tribals in the State of Andhra Pradesh has got a positive fillip.

2. Although a substantial progress has been achieved in securing the benefits of economic development to tribal people, a number of challenges continue to confront them. The tribal economy is still plagued with low growth potential, poor infrastructure, lack of entrepreneurship, inadequate control over natural resources etc due to which the growth indices of tribal area continued to be far below the indicators for the rest of the State. While the Constitution of India and a series of legislations – both central and the state – protect the interests of the scheduled tribes, majority of them continue to remain vulnerable to deprivation and distress and are subjected to insecurity relating to livelihoods, nutrition, health and education.

3. With a view to consolidate the achievements gained thus far and to accelerate the pace of implementation of various enactments, policies, programs and related initiatives, the Government have decided to launch a comprehensive policy package for the holistic development of 50.24 lakh ST population of the state during the next five years. The policy will endeavour to fill the gaps in the existing tribal development framework, strengthen the service delivery system, ameliorate the conditions responsible for the distress and deprivation being experienced by those living in remote and interior areas, address the emerging challenges confronting the tribal communities, especially those living in the sub-plan areas of the State. Through this policy, Government rededicates itself to the task of growth with equity and justice.

VISION OF THE POLICY:

4. The policy envisions the following.

- (a) To double the income of every tribal household by 2015 through provision of assets that produce sustainable income.
- (b) Achieve human development indices with specific reference to demographic, education, health and livelihoods on par with other areas.

- (c) To address the issue of unemployment in educated tribal youth in a mission mode and provide job opportunities through skill up gradation to one lakh tribal youth by 2015.
- (d) To empower tribal communities to effectively fight exploitation.
- (e) To identify and operationalize resources required for implementation of development programs for tribals by effective utilization of the Tribal Sub Plan allocations.
- (f) Achieve effective convergence of activities of various departments at field level and thereby improving the service delivery system.

5. The Empowerment Policy of the Government envisages initiating concerted action in critical areas so as to bring about tangible change in the income levels and living conditions of tribals. The specific efforts would be focused in key sectors as mentioned below.

1. POVERTY ALLEVIATION:

As per 2001 census, the incidence of poverty in tribal areas is 61%. It is proposed to be brought down to less than 30% by 2015. Specific efforts would be initiated in the direction of organizing all tribal women into self help groups and ensuring that institutional credit is made available to all groups on fair terms. Their livelihoods will be strengthened through special land development projects, provision of irrigation facilities, development of horticulture and commercial plantations etc.,

2. EDUCATION:

The human development indicators of the ST population are much lower than the HDI of the rest of the population in terms of all parameters.

The Literacy rate of STs was 37.04 in the 2001 census, which is well below the overall state average of 60.47. The literacy among ST women was 26.11 as against 50.43 women literacy rate in the state.

Similarly the drop out rate among tribal school going children of Class I to X is also alarming. During the year 2008-09 it was 81.77 against a state average of 60.73 and among ST Girls it was 82.76 as against as state average of 61.38.

The low literacy and high drop out, especially among tribal girls, are the areas of serious concern. To address these issues, the following steps will be taken.

- Upgrading and strengthening existing Ashram and Residential Schools with required staffing by creating new posts, wherever necessary, in English, Physical Science and Mathematics
- Opening additional Hostels and Residential Schools at primary, secondary, Intermediate levels with special focus on ST Girl Child.
- 100% enrollment of tribal children and reduction of dropout rate, with special focus on tribal girl child education by developing enumeration and tracking system for out of school children.
- Pre School learning centers would be opened to prepare the ST children for learning in their mothertongue and transcend into Telugu.
- Filling up all vacancies of teachersby conducting special recruitment drives.
- Special training modules in English, Mathematics and Sciences will be developed and intensive trainings will be given to all untrained tribal graduate teachers working in tribal areas.
- Strengthening of existing set up ofeducational planning, inspections & monitoring of schools and colleges by linking it to State Level Project Management Unit and ITDA level Project Management.

3. HEALTH:

Tribal population is far behind in all health indicators when compared with population living in plain areas due to inaccessibility and illiteracy.

The health indicators are poor in tribal areas as compared to the plain areas. Status of some of the indicators in reproductive and child health care is shown below.

While Government will continue existing public health care programs with renewed vigor, the essential focus would be on improving performance under the reproductive and child health care. The frame work for such thrust would be:

- Positioning trained Dais in every habitation to conduct safe deliveries.
- Coverage of 108 services to all habitations.
- Construction of birth waiting rooms near every PHC.
- Encourage tribal women for institutional deliveries.
- Federations of Self Help Groups at Mandal and Village level will be trained to monitor coverage of immunization of all children.
- Suitable incentive package to be developed for community based organizations which achieve universal coverage of immunization.
- Community level task force will be developed in partnership with NGOs and other organizations working in tribal areas to promote awareness about Family Planning and provide access for the same.

- 49% of the tribal population are malnourished at present. Efforts would be made to bring down the level of malnourishment of 15% by starting area specific food security schemes during the lean season. Health and nutrition centres will be opened in all habitations where PTGs are predominant. The centres will be managed by the community with the financial support of the Government. Health and nutritional centres will provide balanced diet to pregnant, lactating mothers and children upto the age of 3 years.

- ART centres will be established at ITDA level. The centres will provide AIDS Diagnosis, Counseling for patients and livelihoods to those effected. ART centres will also disseminate awareness about AIDS prevention by conducting special camps in all habitations.

4. SKILL & CAREER DEVELOPMENT FOR TRIBAL YOUTH:

It is decided to upgrade and create employment opportunities to (1) lakh tribal youth in public and private sectors. To achieve this the following will be addressed.

- A series of market oriented career avenues will be identified and training will be imparted to tribal youth.
- Micro Industrial Clusters will be promoted in all ITDAs and entrepreneur development trainings will be imparted to qualified tribal youth to promote them in setting up of mini industries.
- The career guidance and employment cells at ITDAs will be strengthened providing infrastructure, career library, technical staff and training to staff on collection and dissemination of career information.

- Strengthening of all existing vocational institutions with necessary infrastructure, filling up vacant posts and sanction of additional staff, if necessary.

5. INFRASTRUCTURE IN TRIBAL AREAS:

The social and physical infrastructure in the tribal areas is inadequate and at a much lower level than the rest of the areas.

A. ROADS:

Out of 5,948 villages in the Scheduled Areas, only 4,856 have some kind of road connectivity leaving 1,092 villages without any connectivity. These villages will be provided road connectivity by designing special projects.

B. ELECTRICITY:

Among the area development programmes, electrification of tribal villages and habitations has been given priority. 11,679 habitations have been electrified leaving 818 habitations which will be covered by 2015 by conventional lines.

C. RURAL WATER SUPPLY:

Out of 12,497 tribal habitations 11,022 habitations have been either partially or fully covered with drinking water supply. Still 1,475 habitations require assured and safe drinking water facilities. These villages will be covered by 2012. 40 LPCD clean and potable drinking water will be provided to every tribal habitation throughout the year.

6. PROTECTION OF TRIBAL LAND:

Land is the most important source of tribal livelihood. The Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Areas Land Transfer Regulation, 1959 was enacted to protect the interest of tribals on land and check alienation of land by non-tribals. Towards this direction following measures should be initiated.

- The progress of restoration of lands would be closely monitored by a High Level State Committee by an assessment of total area alienated and fixation of annual targets of restoration.
- A Legal Cell will be set up in each ITDA to proactively identify cases of alienation and to provide legal services to the tribal communities. Law Graduates from Scheduled Tribes or Civil Society organizations will be drafted into Legal Cells who will work for tribals through a team of para legal youth.

- Land records in the Scheduled Areas will be computerized and updated.
- A Land Library will be established which will maintain Court orders, etc., at ITDA level to access information and pursue redressal in LTR cases.

7. RECOGNITION OF FOREST RIGHTS (RoFR) ACT:

Certificates of titles (individual and community rights) were issued covering an extent of 14.00 lakh acres so far. Recognition of Forest Rights will be continued and titles covering an additional extent of 5.00 lakh acres will be issued within the next year. The positive effects of this land mark initiative will be further strengthen by the following:

- Cases booked against STs under various forest offences should be withdrawn under the provisions of RoFR Act.
- Demarcation of the lands on the field & maintenance of the database of rights conferred under RoFR by the Forest and Revenue Departments.
- Comprehensive development of land given rights under RoFR will be taken up dovetailing NREGS. Such an initiative is expected to augment productivity of land and help tribal farmer realize higher income.
- It is the resolve of this policy to increase the land productivity by a multi-layer treatment starting with land development, moisture conservation, provision of irrigation, organic farming & horticulture activities.
- In order to impart necessary farming know how, systematic training programmes will be conducted in the villages through suitable extension network.

8. TRIBAL SUB PLAN:

Government reaffirms its commitment to ensure that 6.6% of the plan budget is spent in tribal areas in key development sectors. It will be ensured that an investment of Rs.14,000 crores would be made in tribal areas by key departments like Education (School Education, Higher Education and Intermediate Education, etc.), Forest, Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Ground Water, Housing, Youth Services, Industries, Rural Development, Transco, Rural Water Supply, Roads (PR & RB), Minor Irrigation, etc.

A Tribal Development Fund (TDF) will be constituted as a non lapsable, non divertible fund for receiving all TSP allocations and financing all tribal programs formulated through the community based planning exercise. Henceforth, monitoring of TSP will be two fold:

- i. Formulation of special projects for the benefit of tribals.
- ii. Implementation of projects and expenditure.

9. RESETTLEMENT AND REHABILITATION:

- Under the projects which displace large number of S.T families, in addition to the socio economic survey for assessment of loss of assets and resources etc., a social

impact assessment survey will also be conducted by a special body consisting expert social scientists, economists, reputed N.G.Os involved in tribal development etc.,.

- In all cases of submergence, mandatory land to land compensation will be given even if it entails acquiring of land.
- As far as possible, such lands for compensation shall be located in the Scheduled Areas to ensure enjoyment of Constitutional Rights by tribals.
- Non-tribals will not be given land compensation for house sites in Scheduled Areas.
- The Scheduled Tribes shall be consulted through Gramasabhas, as provided under the PESA Act, 1996 in providing the benefits under R&R policy especially the location of R&R centre, allotment of lands etc.
- To the extent possible, R&R centres for the scheduled tribe Project Displaced Families will be located in scheduled areas only to preserve their right of reservation for local scheduled tribes under V schedule.
- The Scheduled tribes in the R&R centers shall be given first priority in coverage under development schemes of different line departments in the first year of resettlement
- While assessing the loss of assets, the community assets and resources and loss of livelihood will also be accounted for.
- Where large number of scheduled tribe families are being displaced, a separate Tribal Development plan will be prepared in consultation with Project Officers ITDA or DTWO concerned and the Commissioner, Tribal Welfare will review the implementation of the same.
- At least one member of a displaced family will be provided employment in the Mining or Industrial Projects by providing necessary skills through appropriate training.
- Ground level monitoring mechanism will include representatives of the Scheduled Tribe PAFs/PDFs.
- All the Acts/Regulations relating to establishment of projects in Scheduled Areas and the related policies of Resettlement and Rehabilitation will be suitably amended to harmonize with the provision of PESA Act - 1996.
- The lands allotted to Scheduled Tribes as compensation for displacement will be free from all encumbrances and on the joint names of wife and husband.

10. PROMOTION / ADVANCEMENT OF TRIBAL CULTURE AND TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE:

Government will take a series of measures to strengthen tribal culture, languages and knowledge by:

- Strengthening of tribal museums.
- Documentation, preservation and dissemination of tribal arts and crafts and providing linkage to the markets.

- Organizing tribal festivals in all district headquarters in a phased manner.
- Supporting the folk art performers in their respective areas of specialization.
- Video documentation of the customs and practices of all the tribal groups in phased manner.
- Establishing Girijan Bhavans in all district headquarters to serve as documentation cum reference centers with facilities for conducting seminars and exhibiting tribal arts and crafts, dances and music and their way of life.
- Documentation and preservation of the traditional tribal knowledge and wisdom
- Dissemination of appropriate indigenous traditional practices for adoption in other areas.
- Yerukala and Kupia languages will also be developed with telugu script for preparation of text books.

11. GOOD GOVERNANCE:

Ensuring good governance and efficient service delivery is a paramount priority under the policy. This is proposed to be achieved through:

- Empowering the Gram Sabha of the scheduled villages under the "Panchayat Raj Extension to Scheduled Areas (PESA) Act".
- Rationalise the Gram Panchayats in the scheduled areas and declare all habitations with more than 500 population as Gram Panchayats.
- Every ITDA will be headed by IAS officers and will be given a fixed tenure of 2 years. Two years service in ITDA will be made mandatory in the first 10 years of service for all IAS officers.
- Strengthening the single line administration, including the provision of adequate staffing for the ITDAs and other government institutions.
- Utilisation of Information Technology to streamline the planning and monitoring of all developmental activities.
- Filling up of all vacant posts in the TSP areas during the 2010-11 financial year and a special package of incentives will be provided to the employees working in the ITDA areas.
- Strengthening the system to prevent issuance of false caste certificate to Scheduled Tribes and take stringent criminal action against those responsible. Strengthening of TCR & TIF for assisting in this exercise.

State Housing Corporation Limited, in his letter 2nd read above, hereby enhance the unit cost of Rural Permanent Houses (RPH) from Rs.45,000/- to Rs.70,000/- and Urban Permanent Houses (UPH) from Rs.55,000/- to Rs.80,000/- . Government of Andhra Pradesh have been implementing an aggressive policy of housing on a saturation mode under the Indiramma Housing scheme. A review of the housing programme reveals that more than 2.13 lakhs houses relating to SCs and 1.22 lakhs relating to STs have remained largely unfinished and in various stages of completion as shown below. The non completion of houses has been to a large extent due to the inability of the SC/ST beneficiaries to mobilize materials in time and complete the houses. Besides there are considerable numbers of not started houses also belonging to SC/ST categories.

2. The Nodal Agency for SCSP/TSP constituted under the SCSP/TSP (Planning, Allocation and Utilization of Financial Resources Act) 2013 have examined the issue in detail and have clearly identified housing as a priority sector to be targeted under SCSP/TSP 2013-14. The issue was reviewed and examined in detail by the Government

and the need to enhance the unit cost for housing has been recognized for urgent intervention.

3. The Managing Director, A.P. State Housing Corporation Ltd. Has submitted detailed proposals for increasing the unit cost of housing which has arisen mainly on account of increase in the cost of inputs. He has also emphasized on the need to ensure the mobilization of materials through the Nirmithi Kendras at the Mandal / Division level.

4. Government after careful examination of the circumstances stated by the Managing Director, A.P. State Housing Corporation Ltd., in his letter 4th read above, hereby enhance the unit cost and fix at Rs.1,00,000/- for SCs and Rs.1,05,000/- for STs under Housing Programme 2013-14 for both rural and urban permanent houses. The enhancement of the cost is applicable from the year 2013-14 for SC/ST beneficiaries and chargeable to the SCSP (789) and TSP (796) heads of account, respectively, as follows:

- a) Houses sanctioned and yet to commence construction on or after 01.04.2013.
- b) Houses under construction but roof has not been cast as on 1.04.2013.

5. Payment under the enhanced unit cost of housing under SCSP/TSP will be in proportion to the stage of completion as follows:

7. Further all the houses under construction and the houses to be constructed for SCs/STs in rural areas have to be provided with Individual Sanitary Latrines (ISL) which should be in the form of WC cum Bath for which an additional amount of Rs.10,000/- would be provided by the Rural Development (RD) Department and Rural Water Supply (RWS) Department as per the G.O. 2nd read above. The execution of these ISLs will be done by APSHCL, along with construction of houses. The APSHCL shall follow the guidelines issued in this regard in the references 2nd and 3rd read above.

8. In order to reduce the burden on the part of the beneficiaries, efforts will be made to provide the materials like Cement, CC Blocks, Door and window frames by the Corporation through Nirmithi Kendras.

9. The funds required to meet the expenditure on account of the above enhanced unit cost by way of additional loan to the SC and ST beneficiaries shall be met from the Budget provided under the Weaker Section Housing Programme and the funds set apart under the Scheduled Caste Sub Plan (SCSP) and Tribal Sub Plan (TSP).

10. The Managing Director, A.P. State Housing Corporation Limited / all the District Collectors / Executive Directors, shall take necessary further action in the matter accordingly.

ORDER:

Government of Andhra Pradesh have made substantial investments through providing Post-Matric Scholarships to ST students on a saturation basis. This laudable initiative over the years has encouraged a large number of ST students to complete professional Courses and other Graduate Courses.

2. The post-liberalized economy has thrown vast opportunities and challenges in India and abroad in respect of education and jobs. Students from the ST community are often handicapped because of their extreme backwardness and social stigma to access the benefit of pursuing education abroad to better their lives. With a view to enable the benefit of higher education in Foreign Universities to meritorious ST students thereby providing them an opportunity for better career prospects within the Country and Abroad, the Tribal Welfare Department has proposed to introduce the scheme of Financial Assistance to ST students for pursuing studies abroad in the name of “Ambedkar Overseas Studies Nidhi”. This proposal was placed before the Nodal agency for TSP during their meetings held on 13.05.2013 and in the meeting held by the State Council for Development of SCs & STs on 21.05.2013. After detailed discussions, the scheme of assisting the ST graduates to pursue higher education in reputed foreign universities was approved for implementation as a new scheme for the benefit of STs from the year 2013-14.

3. “Ambedkar Overseas Studies Nidhi” will be sanctioned to (100) ST Students every year and is open to all eligible ST Students in proportion to the population of the community to pursue Post Graduate studies abroad subject to the following guidelines:

- (a) **Income:** ST Students whose family income is less than Rs.2.50 lakhs per annum from all sources are eligible. Total income from all sources of the employed candidates or his/her parents/guardians, shall not exceed Rs.2.50 lakhs per annum. In case of employees, salary certificate from the employer is a must. In all cases the income certificate must be obtained from concerned authorities. A copy of the latest tax assessment as well as the latest monthly salary slip from the employer is also required to be enclosed with the application.
- (b) **Age:** The Maximum age under the scheme shall not exceed 35 years as on 1st July of the year of advertisement.

(c) Qualification:

1. **For Post Graduation Course:** 60% marks or equivalent grade in foundation Degree in Engineering / Management / Pure Sciences / Agriculture Sciences / Medicine & Nursing / Social Sciences / Humanities.
2. **For Ph.D. Course:** 60% marks or equivalent grade in P.G. Course in Engineering / Management / Pure Sciences / Agriculture Sciences / Medicine/ Social Sciences / Humanities.

(d) One child in a family one time Award: Not more than one child of the same parents / guardian's will be eligible and to this effect a self certificate will be required from the candidate. The awardee cannot be considered for the second or subsequent times as the individual can be awarded only once in a life time.

(e) Countries eligible under the Scheme: USA, UK, Australia, Canada and Singapore.

(f) Mandatory Requirements:

- i. He / She should have a valid TOEFL / IELTS & GRE / GMAT.
- ii. He / She should have obtained admission in an accredited Foreign University.
- iii. He / She should possess a valid Passport.
- iv. The Candidate should make his/her own efforts in seeking admission in an accredited University / Institution Abroad.
- v. The selected candidate has to join the concerned University within one year of communication of selection. On expiry of this specified period of time, the award will be automatically cancelled and come to an end. No request for extension of time for availing the award is permissible under the Scheme.
- vi. The candidate shall not change the course of study or research for which the scholarship has been sanctioned.
- vii. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to obtain the appropriate visa for a country wherein one intends to study further under award from the Scheme and the Visa issuing authorities may kindly see that only such type of Visa be issued which only permits the candidate to pursue specified course abroad and thereafter the candidate returns to India.
- viii. The applications should be complete in all respects and should be accompanied by all relevant documents. The applications, incomplete in any respect, are liable to be rejected.

4. Procedure for Selection:

- i. Notification shall be issued in leading dailies calling for applications and wide publicity will be given in University Campuses and in e-PASS portal in August / September and in January / February of the year (this year i.e. 2013-14, being the first year for implementation of the scheme, first notification shall be issued in June / July in lieu of January / February).

- ii. All such students desirous of applying for financial assistance for studies abroad shall apply online from 1st August to 30th September and again from 1st January to 29th February of the year.
- iii. 33% of the awards shall be earmarked for Women Candidates.
- iv. Awards shall be given proportionate to the population of various communities of STs.
- v. The registration shall be made under the scheme online at <http://www.apsocialwelfare.cgg.gov.in>.
- vi. The student shall submit the following documents:
 - Caste Certificate from concerned authorities.
 - Income Certificate from concerned authorities.
 - Date of Birth Certificate.
 - Aadhar Card.
 - E-Pass ID Number.
 - Residential / Nativity Certificate.
 - Passport copy.
 - Mark sheet from SSC / Inter / Graduate / PG Level.
 - GRE / GMAT or equivalent qualifying exam / test score card.
 - TOFEL / IELTS score card.
 - Admission offer letter from Foreign University (I-20, letter of Admission or equivalent)
 - Copy of the latest Tax Assessment is to be enclosed.
 - Copy of Bank Pass Book of Nationalized Bank.
 - Photo to be scanned and uploaded.
- vii. **Selection Committee:** The Selection shall be conducted by a State Level Screening Committee constituted by Government with the following members. The Bio-data of the candidates who applied online shall be made available to the Committee.

5. **Scholarship Amount:**

- a) **Fees:** Fees shall be payable in Two installments as follows:

Installment-I: An amount of Rs.5.00 lakhs shall be payable to the students upon production of the landing permit / I-94 card. (Immigration Card).

Installment-II: An amount of Rs.5.00 lakhs shall be payable to the students upon production of the 1st Semester results.
- b) Sanction Proceedings specifying the amount of Rs.10.00 lakhs will be issued to the individual towards fees and living expenses by way of a grant subject to his/her joining the Course and the Candidates selected by the Selection Committee. The

sanction proceedings can be made use of by the Candidates for obtaining a Visa from the respective Embassy.

- c) **Educational Loan**: The Student shall be eligible for an educational loan of Rs.5.00 lakhs from any Nationalized bank at prevailing rates of interest.
- d) **Earnings from Research/Teaching Assistance-Ship**: The awardees are permitted to supplement their prescribed allowances by undertaking Research/Teaching Assistance ship.
- e) **Passage grant**: One way cheap ticket (Lower fare) by economy class through the shortest route shall be payable upon production of valid visa and admission particulars.
- f) **Visa Fees**: The total visa fees shall be reimbursed to the student upon production of valid visa and production of receipts.
6. **Utilization Certificate**: Utilization certificates shall be obtained from the student with the endorsement of concerned University Authorities for record purpose under the scheme.

ORDER:

The Government of Andhra Pradesh have taken a policy decision to provide financial assistance to ST students desirous of pursuing higher studies in Foreign Countries, separate orders have been issued for this purpose. To seek admission in reputed foreign universities, students have to obtain good scores in tests of English proficiency such as TOEFL & IELTS and in General Aptitude Tests such as GRE / GMAT or equivalent qualifying examinations for pursuing admissions into various Post Graduate Courses in reputed foreign universities.

2. Most of the ST students, due to their extreme backwardness, poor knowledge of English and other disabilities are often unable to perform up to the mark in the above said qualifying exams. Therefore, with a view to equip the ST students with requisite skills by providing them the benefit of coaching for the above exams, Tribal Welfare Department has proposed to Govt. to hereby facilitate coaching in TOEFL / IELTS /GRE/GMAT etc., in the existing & reputed coaching institutions to make possible admission of ST students in professional courses like Medicine, Engineering, Pharmacy etc Nursing and for PG Courses in Pure Sciences, Humanities, Social Studies etc., in reputed foreign universities. This proposal was placed before the Nodal agency for TSP during their meeting held on 13-05-2013 and in the meeting held by the State Council for Development of SCs & STs on 21-05-20-13. After detailed discussions, the scheme of Coaching to ST Students for Eligibility Tests for Admissions in Foreign Universities in the TSP was approved for implementation as a new scheme for the benefit of STs from the year 2013-14.

Eligibility: ST Graduates or final year students at Graduation level whose family income is less than Rs.2.00 lakhs per annum.

OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES:

I. Selection under the scheme:

- a) A Notification for short listing institutions to impart training to ST students shall be issued in April / May calling for applications from reputed institutes from Hyderabad, Vijayawada, Tirupathi and Warangal having experience imparting training for GRE/TOFEL/GMAT/IELTS.
- b) Institutes shall apply online by May 15th of the year in a prescribed format with details of Name & Address, Registration Number, details of courses offered, infrastructure and faculty available, capacity, achievements, Bank Account number, etc.
- c) A State Level Committee with following members shall shortlist the applications by May 31st of the year. The State Level Committee shall allot a fixed number of seats to the selected institutes.
 - a. Commissioner of Tribal Welfare (Chairman).
 - b. Secretary, A.P. T.W. Residential Educational Institutions Society, (Gurukulam) Hyderabad (Member).
 - c. MD, AP ST Cooperative Finance Corporation Limited, (TRICOR) Hyderabad (Member).
 - d. Additional Director, Tribal Welfare (Member)
 - e. Representative from the State Council of Higher Education. (Member)
 - f. Joint Director, Education O/o Commissioner of Tribal Welfare (Convener)
- d) There shall be automated selection of the students and allotment to the institute of their choice on merit basis by giving due weightage to marks obtained in SSC, Intermediate & Graduation.
- e) The duration of training shall vary from 60 hours to 100 hours based on the course of study.
- f) Standardized Course material shall be made available to the candidates sponsored by Tribal Welfare Department.
- g) The Institute shall forward the scores obtained by the students in the respective exams.
- h) Online test facility shall be made available to the Candidates sponsored by Tribal Welfare Department.

II. Selection of Candidates under the Scheme:

- a) Notification calling for applications from desirous ST students shall be issued twice in a year, June and October of the year mentioning the institutes selected and courses offered.
- b) The scheme is open to all ST students whose annual family income is less than 2.50 lakhs per year.
- c) The interested students shall apply online by June 30th of the year for the 1st session and by October 30th of the year for the 2nd session, in a prescribed application form indicating his preference for the institute in which he wants to undergo training.
- d) The course for the 1st session shall commence from July 1st of the year and the 2nd session shall commence from November 1st of the year.
- e) Application by Students: All students shall apply online with scanned copies of the following documents:
 - Caste Certificate from concerned authorities.
 - Income Certificate from concerned authorities.
 - SSC Certificate.
 - Date of Birth Certificate.
 - Degree Certificate / Bonafide certificate showing proof of study in Degree final year.
 - Aadhar card.

III Fees payable under the Scheme:

- a) The following rates per student are fixed as the upper limit for the various coaching programme.

Fee reimbursed to the institutes shall be as indicated above or the actual fee charged by the institute for the respective course whichever is less. 50% shall be paid as first installment on completion of 50 hours of training and the remaining 50% shall be released on completion of 100 hours of training.

- b) Attendance of the student shall be maintained by the institute and is mandatory for claiming coaching charges by the institute.
- c) The training programme shall include the following components:
- Classroom coaching by trained faculty.
 - Audio /Visual training.
 - Standard coaching material to be made available to the student.
 - Individual evaluation of students' skill to be maintained.
 - Certificate to be given at the end of the training.
 - Online Test facility.
- d) The charges for training shall be released through online transactions by respective District Officers to the Bank Accounts of the institutes.

The Govt. have introduced the scheme of Special Hostels during year 1994-95 and sanctioned (27) Special Hostels vide reference 1st cited. The guidelines for admission of the PMC hostels were issued vide reference 2nd read above. On the proposal of the Commissioner, T.W. another (33) Post-matric College Hostels were sanctioned vide reference 3rd read above and another (50) Post Matric College Hostels were sanctioned to Tribal Welfare Dept. vide reference 4th read above.

2. Further, the Government have sanctioned (126) Post Matric College Hostels to the Tribal Welfare Department for Post-matric students studying in various Postmatric Institutions in all the Districts during the year 2010-11 vide reference 5th read above. The Govt. have also sanctioned (126) Posts of Hostel Welfare Officers Grade-II to all the above Post Matric College Hostels vide reference 6th read above and sanctioning of the posts of Class-IV Employees to all the above said PMC Hostels matter is under consideration.

3. In tune with the Tribal Empowerment Policy 2010-15 and also in compliance to the 9 point program announced by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 12-1-2012 and as part of Sunnamvari Gudem declaration articulated by Hon'ble CM on 8-8-2012 the Department has proposed to construct permanent buildings to all Post Matric College Hostels. For effective implementation of the Scheduled Castes Sub Plan and Tribal Sub Plan, the Government constituted "State Council for Development for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes" in the G.O. 3rd read above to advise State Government on all the policy matters relating to Scheduled Castes Sub Plan/ Tribal Sub Plan, suggest measures for proper planning and implementation of schemes by the departments and approve the Annual Scheduled Castes Sub Plan/Tribal Sub Plan proposals submitted by the Nodal Agency constituted in the G.O. 2nd read above.

3. The Nodal Agency for TSP in its meeting held on 13.05.2013 after thorough deliberations, has agreed and recommended for approval of ongoing and new works program for the year 2013-14 vide reference 7th read above.

4. The State Council for development of SCs & STs approved proposal of TSP for 2013-14 vide reference 8th read above, as detailed below.

- I. Approved 1404 ongoing works at an estimated cost of Rs.945.95 crores and
- II. 864 new works at an estimated cost of Rs.725.20 crore.

5. The department wise No. of ongoing and new works approved for 2013-14 are appended in the Annexure to this Government Order.
6. The concerned departments are requested to take necessary action for according necessary administrative/technical sanctions, works wise, wherever necessary.
7. The concerned Heads of Departments are requested to report compliance to Nodal Department and ensure that these works are completed during 2013-14.
8. The Commissioner of Tribal Welfare, AP, Hyderabad is requested to take all necessary steps for ensuring the completion of works program approved by the State Council within the time frame.

ORDER:

The Tribal Welfare Department, in tune with Tribal Empowerment Policy, 2010-2015 and also in compliance to the 9-point Program for Tribal Development announced by Hon'ble Chief Minister and as part of the Sunnamvari-gudem Declaration articulated by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 08-08-2012, has proposed to take measures for providing quality education for ST students in the State. In that direction Tribal Welfare Department has proposed to increase the number of pre-matric scholarships to be sanctioned to the ST students studying in the Best Available Schools in the State by another 2,300 seats during 2013-2014.

2. The scheme of Pre-matric Scholarships of Tribal Welfare Department is a plan scheme and hence the scheme is brought under the purview of the Tribal Sub Plan and as per the provisions of the AP SCSP and TSP (Planning, Allocation and Resources Utilization) Act, 2013, the schemes have to be placed before the Nodal Agency for TSP for their appraisal and for recommending the same for approval of the State Council for the development of SCs and STs.

3. The Nodal Agency for TSP in its meeting held on 13.05.2013, after thorough deliberations, has agreed and recommended the schemes under TSP of Tribal Welfare Department of 2013-14 for approval of the State Council.
4. The State Council for development of SCs & STs in its meeting held on 21.05.2013 has approved the proposal of Nodal agency of TSP.
5. Keeping in view the decision of the State Council, Commissioner, Tribal Welfare requested for issuing necessary administrative sanction for increasing the intake of ST students by another 2,300 for admission into the Best Available Schools in the State and he informed that an amount of Rs.25.10 Crores has been allocated for the scheme under Plan for 2013-14.
6. The Commissioner, Tribal Welfare has informed that among 6,120 existing seats under the Best Available Schools, only 4,873 students get renewed for 2013-14, leaving 1,247 seats vacant. He further informed that the existing vacancies of 1,247 seats and the increased intake of 2,300 put together, a total of 3,547 seats will be available for allotment to the districts during the year 2013-14.
7. The Commissioner, Tribal Welfare has informed that as per the provisions of the TSP Act, one of the important objectives is to promote equity in the development among various social groups within Scheduled Tribes and also to pay special attention to the Scheduled Tribes residing in Scheduled areas and hence he proposed for an equitable allocation of seats.
8. Government after careful examination of the proposal of Commissioner, Tribal Welfare hereby orders that:
 - a) There shall be an increase of 2,300 seats for sanctioning pre-matric scholarships for ST students studying in the Best Available Schools and the sanction of scholarships shall be as per the procedure ordered by Government vide G.O.Ms. No. 70 Social Welfare (TW.Edn.II) Department Dated: 01-08-2001, except that the mode of selection of students shall be by way of drawing lots.

b) Additional number of 2,300 seats sanctioned for the year and the existing vacancies of 1,247 put together the total vacancies of 3,547 shall be distributed among the districts for the year 2013-14 as per the principles given below:

i) 10% of the total seats i.e., 842 seats shall be allotted to the scheduled areas in addition to their normal entitlement as per the population proportion since the AP SCSP and TSP Act,2013 at Section. 6 envisages that **“In case of Tribal Sub Plan, special attention shall be paid to Scheduled Tribes residing in the Scheduled Areas”**.

ii) Further, in addition to the above another 10% of the total seats, i.e., 842 seats shall be allotted to the ST students belonging to PTG communities based on the proportion of their population to district population in view of the low levels of literacy of the PTG communities and since the AP- SCSP and TSP Act, 2013 at Section. 6 envisages **“to promote equity in development among various social groups within Scheduled Tribes”**.

iii) The remaining 80% of the total seats 6,736 seats shall be distributed among all the 23 districts as per the population of STs of the districts to the total ST population of the State as per 2001 census and allocation of the vacant and increased seats (3547) as shown at **Annexure**.

iv) And the entry point for filling up of these vacancies is at Class III in addition to Class V and VIII in the ratio of 50%, 25% & 25% for III, V & VIII respectively.

v) From 2014-15 onwards, the vacancies that arise consequent to children passing out X class or due to admission into other institutions shall also be filled up by students belonging to the same tribal group only.

9. Further the District Level Committees as constituted vide G.O. Ms.No.70, SW (TW.Edn.II) Department, Dt.: 01-08-2001 for implementing the scheme shall distribute the seats allocated to the districts from among the mandals and among various tribes based on their population to the total district ST population to ensure equitable distribution of the opportunity. Detailed guidelines and formats shall be issued by Commissioner, Tribal Welfare in this regard.

10. Further the existing criterion of ceiling for annual parental income to make the child eligible for sanctioning of scholarship under the scheme is revised from Rs.18,000/- to Rs.2,50,000/- per annum on par with the provision existing for sanctioning post-matric scholarships for ST students.

11. The expenditure towards sanctioning the pre-matric scholarships to the ST students admitted under this allocation shall be debited to the following head of account since adequate provision has been made for the proposed additional intake of 2,300 seats under the scheme.

ORDER:

The Tribal Welfare Department, in tune with Tribal Empowerment Policy, 2010-2015 and also in compliance to the 9-Point Program for Tribal Development announced by Hon'ble Chief Minister and as part of the Sunnamvarigudem Declaration articulated by Hon'ble Chief Minister on 08.8.2012, has proposed to take measures for providing quality education for ST students in the State.

2. In Tribal Welfare Department there were (442) Hostels functioning and the boarders staying in the Hostels going for Schools run by other managements such as Zilla Parishad, School Education and other managements. Whereas Tribal Welfare Department has also been running Ashram Schools where boarding and instruction take place under the same roof. The performance of boarders of Hostels has been relatively poor compared to that of Ashram Schools due to the following reasons:

- a) That the schools where the boarders study are not under the direct control of Tribal Welfare Department and as a result the performance of these institutions is not being directly monitored,

- b) That in an Ashram School the teachers are available before and after instructional hours also and attend to supervised studies, remedial coaching and such services are not available to the boarders of the Hostels,
 - c) That Tribal Welfare Department is taking up various initiatives for improving quality of education in the Ashram Schools from time to time.
3. Hence, Commissioner, Tribal Welfare reported that there has been a demand to convert the Hostels into Ashram Schools in a phased manner. And he also informed that efforts have also been put in the past and (63) Hostels have been converted into Ashram Schools so far.
4. In order to continue these efforts, Commissioner, Tribal Welfare has now proposed to convert (50) Hostels in the ITDA districts as detailed in the **annexure**. After carefully examining the proposal, sanction is hereby accorded for converting (50) TW Hostels in to Ashram Schools by opening (50) TW Primary Schools in the premises of the Hostels during 2013-14 in the ITDA districts.
5. The process of conversion shall be as follows:
- a) A Tribal Welfare Primary School shall be opened in the premises of the Hostel.
 - b) The school shall have (4) S G Teachers and the senior most shall function as Headmaster of the school.
 - c) Initially the school shall start functioning with Classes III to V with each class having (40) students in each section and it will be upgraded to an Upper Primary School in 2014-15 by opening Classes VI and VII and will be further upgraded to a High School in the subsequent academic year.
 - d) After the school is opened, the boarders studying from Class III to V in other institutions shall be transferred to the newly opened Primary School. However, boarders studying classes VI to X shall continue as boarders and they shall continue to attend schools in which they are studying.

- e) As per Section 27 of the Education Act, 1982, the schools are deemed to have been hereby recognized simultaneously by opening of the schools.
- f) The Hostel section of the school shall continue to function with Hostel Welfare Officer and the Class IV staff as usual.
6. For opening the (50) Primary Schools, (200) teachers posts are required @ (4) teachers per school and the concerned Project Officers of ITDAs shall deploy the posts and allotted to the schools as shown in **annexure**.

7. The salaries of the teachers shall be debited to the following head of account:

8. This order does not require the concurrence of the Finance Department as the sanction does not contain any additional financial implication on Government exchequer. ORDER:

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has been making sustained efforts to provide quality health care to its citizens, with special attention to the disadvantaged strata of the society and those living in remote and interior areas. In this direction, the Government has been implementing various health schemes, programmes and activities with the aim of achieving the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) by making the health delivery system effective and responsive to the needs of the people.

2. However, despite substantial increase in investment in infrastructure, human resources, capacity development, equipment, materials, supplies and multi-pronged efforts, there is need for further improvement in the health indicators in tribal areas especially amongst the children. There is an urgent need to provide continuous health monitoring and regular counseling for health seeking behavior for overall development of students in tribal areas. There is a need for specialized services to take care of health needs of residential educational institutions in tribal areas.

3. The Hon'ble Chief Minister during his "**Indiramma Bata**" in Khammam District made **Sunnamvari Gudem Declaration** to provide Fixed Day Health Services (FDHS) to the students of residential educational institutions in tribal areas.

4. The Commissioner of Tribal Welfare and Commissioner, Health & Family Welfare, Hyderabad conducted a workshop for Project Officers, ADMHOs and other staff of ITDAs at Rampachodavaram of East Godavari District on 26.9.2012 and 27.9.2012 for preparation of a project for establishment and operationalization of FDHS to the residential educational institutions of ITDAs areas and submitted detailed project proposals to the Government.

5. The Commissioner of Health & Family Welfare has estimated that the implementation of the proposed FDHS under the name Rajiv Bala Sanjeevini would require one time capital cost of Rs. 5.628 Crores and an annual operational cost of Rs.6.54 Crores. The Tribal Welfare Department have agreed to provide capital cost of Rs.5.628 Crores and annual operational cost of Rs.6.54 Crores under the Tribal Sub Plan till Government of India includes the Scheme in NRHM.

6. Government, after careful examination of the proposal hereby accords permission to the Commissioner of Health and Family Welfare to implement the Rajiv Bala Sanjeevini scheme under Public and Not-for-Profit Partnership by entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with M/s GVK EMRI who have been running 108 services across Andhra Pradesh, have presence in the proposed operational areas , health fleet management experience , and senior management and IT expertise to handle and guide such project with low gestation period. The details of the Scheme are annexed to this order.

7. The Commissioner of Health & Family Welfare, Hyderabad/ Commissioner of Tribal Welfare shall take further necessary action accordingly.

Operational Guidelines for Implementation of Rajiv Bala Sanjeevini Scheme

Objectives

1. The objectives of Rajiv Bala Sanjeevini (RBS) include the following :
 - Comprehensive health care service through fortnightly fixed day health service to students in residential education institutions in 9 ITDAs areas
 - Referral care services to all students in the residential educational institutions in 9 ITDAs on 24X7 basis
 - Development and maintenance of a robust online data management system for student health profile.

Methodology

2. RBS will be implemented in 9 ITDAs through 32 Mobile Health Units (MHUs). ITDA wise break of the MHUs is as follows:

3. MHUs will provide the fortnightly fixed day health services (FDHS) to the students in residential educational institutions in ITDA areas. The PO ITDAs will list the residential education institutions for RBS and which will be confirmed by the Commissioner Tribal Welfare (CTW). Each MHU will visits 1 to 3 residential education institutions every day depending on the strength of students and distances. MHU schedule will be prepared for 12 days in a fortnight. The MHU, therefore, will visit the allocated residential education institutions twice in a month.

Staffing Pattern

4. The proposed staffing pattern under RBS for the MHU, referral hospitals and ITDAs are as follows:

5. The medical officer along with the staff would attend the institution in a vehicle equipped with all the required medical equipment. All the students will be screened; diagnostic tests conducted if needed, and with those with illness will be provided medicine then and there itself. The MHU team would also conduct IEC activities for students to promote health seeking behaviour, supervise health and sanitary conditions of residential education institutions and orient the staff in first aid , health care and maintenance of hygiene.

Referral Cases

6. For students who need specialized treatment, RBS will provide end to end referral care i.e. from identification of referral cases to return back after completion of treatment. The Medical Officer / Specialist doctor will identify the students who need referral care and treatment. , if any, and refer to the identified referral hospitals of the respective ITDA.

Referral Hospitals

7. For each of ITDA, the Commissioner , Health and Family Welfare (CHFV) and CTW will identify and notify a referral hospital and get 5 beds allocated exclusively for the referral student cases of the ITDA area. Each ITDA is provided with one exclusive referral vehicle and coordinator. The coordinator at ITDA shall ensure that the referral case is transported from school to identified referral hospital .The referral coordinator at referral hospital will attend the referral case from admission to discharge of the student.

Data and Reports

8. Each MHU Health Unit will have a laptop with data connectivity. Web based application/ portal will be developed for online management of RBS programme. Demographic and health profile shall be digitised, screening, diagnosis and treatment particulars uploaded and up dated regularly as and when the MHU visits the institution or cases are referred or emergency transportation takes place. All the residential institutions, students, diseases and treatment details will be plotted on the GIS maps and analysed for policy decisions and corrective measures.

9. The standardised and special reports of different types, levels and periodicity - daily, weekly and monthly will be generated and sent to the Medical Officer, PO,ITDA, Additional DM&HO/Deputy DM&HO, DDTW , CHFV and CTW.

Call Centre

10. A 24X7 dedicated call centre services will be provided for the students in health, counselling and for referral care of the selected residential educational institutions.

Committees at Different Levels

11. A committee headed by the PO ITDA with Additional DMHO (Tribal) / Deputy DMHO (Tribal), and Deputy Director Tribal Welfare as members shall be oversee the

implementation and coordination of RBS at District level. At state level, special officer O/o CHFV under supervision of CTW and CHFV will coordinate and monitor RBS. Separate guidelines will be issued by CTW regarding formation of RBS committees at different levels and their role in smooth implementation of RBS.

Costing and Financial Guidelines

12. The scheme will be funded by Tribal Welfare Department under Tribal Sub Plan till Government of India includes this scheme in NRHM. The CHFV and State Project Director NRHM will follow up with the Government of India for inclusion of RBS under NRHM funding.

13. The 100% operational and capital expenditure will be borne by the Government and GVK EMRI will be responsible for implementation of RBS including providing human resources, fleet management and call advisory services.

14. The estimated capital costs are as follows. However, CHFV and CTW will re-examine the items proposed and finalize the items of capital expenditure in consultation with GVK EMRI, select POs of ITDAs and MD APHMIDC. All payments shall be based on actuals.

17. Operational costs are indicative. The CHFW and CTW will put an expert committee to examine the proposed operational expenditure and revise the same to ensure cost effectiveness and value for money.

18. The operational costs shall be paid quarterly basis in advance. Separate bank account, cash book, ledger books and other financial instruments shall be maintained for RBS.

19. The operational expenditure, capital expenditure, human resources and assets of this scheme are ring fenced to AP operations.

20. The referral expenditure (i.e. for transportation of student along with the parents/guardians, diet for students and attendants, hospital costs and cost towards medicines and consumables for follow up treatment) for the entire referral mechanism shall be borne under this programme. This expenditure is not part of regular operational expenditure as indicated in Para 14 and shall be released separately based on actuals.

21. The savings accrued in the quarter shall be adjusted to next quarter operational expenditure. The savings shall not be diverted to the purpose other than RBS.

22. All the expenditure is subject to audit by resident auditor, statutory auditors appointed by CH&FW, auditors from CAG and NRHM. Monthly SoE, UC and bank statement shall be submitted on or before 10th of subsequent month.

23. Any procurement shall be done through procurement committee constituted for 108 services with officer from Tribal welfare department as co-opted in the committee.

24. The capital expenditure shall be released immediately within 15 days from the date of signing of MoU. The estimated capital expenditure is based on existing market rates. The expenditure is limited to the actuals. In case of actual is more than estimated, the balance shall be released to GVK EMRI. In case of actual are less than estimated the savings shall be returned to Government.

25. The financial estimates are for budgetary purposes and release of advance payment. The adjustment of expenses against advance grant will be made on the basis of actual quarterly expenditure for which audited utilization certificate have to be submitted.

Agreement Guidelines

26. The CHFW and CTW will enter into an MoU with GVK EMRI for the implementation of the RBS with clear service level agreements. The validity of the MoU will be for a year initially and to be reviewed after a quick evaluation.

27. Government is the owner for all the physical assets, data, procedures and other software applications developed for the above scheme with Government funds.

28. In case of expansion of programme above 32 vehicles, the same terms and conditions will be applied.

ORDER:

Government have been taking up the Weaker Section Housing Programme as a priority activity for the past several years covering ST beneficiaries also. Now, it has been brought to the notice of the Government that many ST families living in housing colonies built with the assistance of Government under various schemes over a period of time consuming less than 50 units of power per month, are not in a position to pay their earlier dues. In to ascertain DISCOMs have carried out a detailed exercise of identifying ST families who are living in ST habitats and consuming less than 50 units of power per month. As per the report submitted by DISCOMs, 3.13 Lakh ST families living in ST habitations have less than 50 units of monthly power Consumption and an amount of Rs.27.00 crores would be required to supply free power to such consumers per annum. DISCOMs have also reported that an amount of Rs.66.21 Crores is pending in dues in respect of 2.31 Lakh such families as on 31.03.2013. The State Government has, therefore, taken a policy decision to provide free power to ST beneficiaries who are residing in ST Housing Colonies and consuming less than 50 units per month.

2. The proposal was discussed in the meeting of the 3rd Nodal agency for TSP held on 13.05.2013 wherein it was recommended to be placed before the State Council.

4. The State Council for Development of SCs and STs for the implementation of Act 1 of 2013 in its meeting held on 21.05.2013 has approved the proposals worth Rs.857.00 crores covering all the Chief Minister's announcements under Indiramma Kalalu which

includes the proposal of payment of current charges and arrears of electricity in respect of ST families living in ST Housing Colonies and consuming less than 50 units of power per month also.

4. Government after careful examination hereby order the Commissioner, Tribal Welfare to:

- a) Pay for the arrears of electricity charges as on 31-3-2013, in respect of 3,13,039 ST families living in ST housing colonies in two installments in Financial Years 2013-14 & 2014-15 at Rs. 33.10 Crores each year and as appended to this G.O.
- b) Pay for the current charges on a monthly basis in respect of all ST households living in ST Housing colonies with monthly consumption of 0-50 units provided that the concerned circle of the DISCOMS, give detailed consumption particulars in respect of each beneficiary in ST colonies whose monthly consumption is 0-50 units.
- c) The scheme would not be applicable to ST families whose consumption is beyond 50 units per month as it is meant for those whose consumption is for basic requirements. Households consuming above 50 units per month will have to pay the entire cost of the energy bill regardless of the actual consumption. The amount payable under 3 (a) & (b) above shall be based on the actual demand consumer wise furnished by the SE of the DISCOM concerned to the P.Os / DTWOs, Tribal Welfare, who shall prefer the claims and payment should be made within two weeks so as to avoid any penal interest. The P.Os / DTWOs Tribal Welfare shall maintain an account for each ST consumer, Housing Colony wise.

5. The amount sanctioned above shall be debited to the following Head of Account:

2225	- Welfare of SCs, STs and OBCs
02	- Welfare of STs
MH 800	- Other expenditure.
GH (11)	- Normal State Plan.
SH (12)	- Providing free power to ST House Holds

6. The Commissioner of Tribal Welfare, Andhra Pradesh, and the CMD, TRANSCO & MD's of all DISCOMS shall take necessary action accordingly in furnishing the detailed claims consumer wise and detailed abstract bill to the respective P.Os/DTWOs, Tribal Welfare of the district to enable drawal of arrears and current claims.

7. The Centre for Good Governance (CGG) shall make available requisite software to enable online payment of Energy bills through the Treasury.

8. This order issues with the concurrence of the Finance (Expr.SW) Department vide their U.O.No.1036/225/A1/Exp.BCW/TW dated 30.08.2013.

ORDER:

The Government of Andhra Pradesh has enacted "The Andhra Pradesh Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub-Plan (Planning, Allocation and Utilization of Financial Resources) Act, 2013". (Act No.1 of 2013) (herein after referred to as Act).

2. The Act is to ensure, accelerated development of Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST) with emphasis on achieving equality in the next ten years focusing on economic, educational and human development along with ensuring security, social dignity and promoting equity among Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, by earmarking a portion, in proportion to the population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the State, of the total plan outlay of the State of Andhra Pradesh as the outlay of the Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP)/Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) of the State.

3. The Act also envisages constitution of "District Monitoring Committee for SCSP &TSP." Under Section 22 (1&2) of the Act, the Government shall constitute a District Monitoring Committee in the each district with the District Collector as its Chairman, which shall be responsible for implementation of the SCSP / TSP in the district. The district Planning Committees of each district shall review the implementation of SCSP/TSP periodically.

4. In the first and second meetings of the State Council for development of SCs and STs under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister which were held on 26.02.2013 and 21-5-2013 respectively, it was decided that the Nodal Agencies should set up the District Monitoring Committee for SCSP &TSP under the Chairmanship of District Collector immediately.

5. In exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 22 (1 & 2) of the Act No. 1 of 2013, Government hereby orders constituting the "District Monitoring Committee for SCSP &

TSP under the chairmanship of District Collector” with the following composition and functions for the matters relating to Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP) and Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP).

6. The composition of the District Monitoring Committee for Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP) and Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) shall be as follows:

7. **Special Invitee-** The District Monitoring Committee may invite any person as deemed necessary as Special Invitee to its meetings.

8. The District Monitoring Committee shall carry out the following functions:

- a. **Implementation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan (SCSP) and Tribal Sub Plan:** The District Monitoring Committee for SCSP and TSP shall review the implementation Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub Plan in the district with line departments for ensuring conformity to the provisions of the Act.

- b. **Frequency of meetings:** The District Monitoring Committee shall meet at least once in two months or as frequently as necessary.
 - c. **Review and Monitoring:** The District Monitoring Committee shall review and monitor the allocation, expenditure and implementation of SCSP and TSP in the district based on the scheme wise physical and financial targets communicated by the Nodal departments from time to time.
 - d. **Monitor the Implementation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal Sub Plan:** The District Monitoring Committee shall monitor the implementation of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal sub plan to promote equity in the development among various social groups within Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and focused development of backward Scheduled Caste habitations and Tribe habitations, with special attention on Scheduled Tribes residing in scheduled areas.
 - e. **Coordination:** The District Monitoring Committee shall coordinate with the departments in the preparation of district level Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal sub plan.
 - f. **Transparency and Accountability:** The District Monitoring Committee shall cause the maintenance of scheme wise, village wise and beneficiary wise details of both physical and financial benefits and shall be placed in the web portal for tracking the progress of the implementation, expenditure, output and outcome indicators as may be prescribed in Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal sub plan.
 - g. **Facilitating Social Audit:** The District Monitoring Committee shall facilitate at least annual social auditing of expenditure of Scheduled Castes Sub-Plan and Tribal sub plan and facilitate analysis of improvement in Human Development Index against the projections for the State and district.
 - h. **Gap analysis** for better targeting i.e. gaps in development, spatial distribution of deprivation of socio economic indicators for prioritizing the investment being utilized for gaps identification shall be done by the District Monitoring Committee.
 - i. **Third party physical verification:** The District Monitoring Committee shall also take up the third party physical verification of works/schemes being implemented under SCSP and TSP.
 - j. **Annual Report:** The District Monitoring Committee shall submit an annual report to the Nodal Department / Nodal Agency of SCSP and TSP on outcome of implementation of SCSP and TSP containing department wise achievements and the un utilized funds during the financial year under report.
9. The sanctions and the selection of beneficiaries, if necessitated, under SCSP & TSP at the district level shall be made with the approval of the District In-charge Minister.

10. Any other function as may be assigned by the Government / Nodal Department / Nodal Agency of SCSP and TSP from time to time.

The Tribal Welfare Department in tune with Tribal Empowerment Policy, 2010-2015 and also in compliance to the 9-point Program for Tribal Development announced by Honorable Chief Minister and as part of the Sunnamvarigudem declaration articulated by Honorable Chief Minister on 8-8-2012, has proposed to strengthen Infrastructure for skill upgradation and training to tribal youth for necessary placement.

2. As part of the plan (50) Youth Training Centers have to be established in the tribal predominant areas of the state. Each center will be set up with infrastructure for training and with an attached hostel.

3. In accordance with the above plan (26) Youth Training Centers were already sanctioned and grounded with an estimated cost of Rs.72.00 Crs. With the grants of IAP and Buildings for School Complexes.

4. The Engineer-in-Chief, TW, Hyderabad has submitted the proposal for sanction of matching grant of Rs.38.15 Crs. for providing additional Infrastructure facilities like 10,000 sft plinth area, compound walls and approach roads etc to (26) Youth Training Centers.

5. Accordingly the proposals were placed before the Nodal Agency for TSP in its 4th meeting held on 2.12.2013 for taking a decision. After thorough deliberations, the Nodal Agency for TSP has agreed and recommended matching grant for already sanctioned (26) Tribal Youth Training Centers along with construction of Tribal Cultural Centre at Araku and Sports Complex at Junior College Ground, Paderu vide reference 8th read above. The

State Council for the development of SCs and STs also approved the same vide reference 9th read above.

6. After careful examination and also keeping in view the decision of the State Council, Administrative Sanction is hereby accorded for matching grant for providing additional infrastructure to (26) Youth Training Centers, construction of Tribal Cultural Centre at Araku and Sports Complex at Jr. College Ground, Paderu as shown in Annexure-I appended, with an estimated cost of Rs.37.35 Crores under TSP 2013-14 scheme of Education Infrastructure. Adequate budget provision of Rs. 60.00 Crores has already been made available under BE 2013-14.

7. The Commissioner, Tribal Welfare and Engineer-in-Chief shall take further necessary action and complete the construction of the said (26) Tribal Youth Training Centers in the current financial year through the Tribal Welfare Engineering Department.

8. The expenditure towards construction of the said (26) Tribal Youth Training Centers shall be debited to the following head of account.

ORDER:

Government of Andhra Pradesh have decided to sanction of Pre-matric Scholarship to curb the high dropout rate of 53.64% as per census 2011 of Department of School Education among S.T, students and encourage education at the secondary level there is need to give incentive in the form of scholarship in Andhra Pradesh by providing a modest incentive to school going ST children from classes V to VIII.

2. The scheme was reviewed and approved by the Nodal Agency in its meeting held by 2-12-2013 vide reference 2nd read above for inclusion under Tribes Sub-Plan 2013-14 and the State Council for development of SCs &STs has also ratified the recommendation of Nodal Agency for Tribal Sub Plan in the reference 3rd read above.

3. The following guidelines are issued for operation of the scheme .These guidelines will come into effect from the academic year 2013-14.

(1) Objective:

To curb the high dropout rate of 53.64% as per census 2011 of Department of School Education among S.T. students and encourage education at the secondary level there is need to give incentive in the form of scholarship in Andhra Pradesh by providing a modest incentive to school going ST children from classes V to VIII.

Pre-metric Scholarship shall be granted to all eligible ST students in classes V to VIII subject to the following conditions

Eligibility: For being eligible under this scheme, the student should:

- i) Belongs to Scheduled Tribe and her/his Parent/Guardian's Annual Income should not exceed Rs. 2.00 Lakhs.
- (ii) He/She should be a regular, full time student studying in a Government School or in a School run by Local Bodies such as Mandal Praja Parishad, Zilla Praja Parishad, Municipalities / Municipal Corporations or any school Aided by the Government.

- iii) Scholarship for studying in any class will be available for only one year. If a student has to repeat a class, she/he would not get scholarship for that class for a second (or subsequent) year.

Scholarship Value:

- 1) Rs.100/- Per Month for Boy (Day Scholars) for 10 months.
- 2) Rs.150/- Per Month for Girls (Day Scholars) for 10 months.

Procedure: The same procedure being adopted for "Pre-Matric Scholarships Scheme for IX to X classes may be adopted for this scheme also.

OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES:

Bank Account:

- i) Each student shall have a bank account in his/her name from any of the Nationalized Banks. Students who are minors shall have a joint account in the name of the student and mother / father / guardian as the case may be.
- ii) The bank account shall be linked to the Aadhar number of the student to enable scholarship transfer. Linkage of the Aadhar Number with the Bank Account will be done by the Manager of the Bank concerned on production of Aadhar Number by the Student / Parent.

Duration and Renewal of Awards :

The scholarship will be payable for 10 months in an academic year.

Renewal Scholarship:

- i) The award once made will continue subject to good conduct and regularity in attendance. It will be renewed for subsequent after the student passes in the previous class.

Applications for Scholarships to be Online:

On the similar lines of Social Welfare, applications may be applied through online and instructions & necessary guidelines for this will be communicated separately.

- 2) Student desirous of availing Pre-Matric Scholarships under the Scheme shall apply online at <http://epass.cgg.gov.in> and click on the Pre-Matric Scholarships for registration form and submit the following details:
 - i. Student details with Name and Address of the School.
 - ii. Parental details with Address.
 - iii. Aadhar linked Bank Account Number with IFSC Code, Bank Name and Bank Branch.
 - iv. Scan and upload Caste, Income Certificate as issued by the Mee-Seva Kendra (certificate other than those issued by Mee-Seva shall not be accepted).
 - v. Scan and upload Aadhar Card No. & the Aadhar document.
 - vi. Aadhar linked Bank Account, pass book to be Scanned and Uploaded (only first stage). The Bank Account shall be in the Name of the Student along with the Mother/Father/Guardian in case the student is a minor.
 - vii. Scan and Upload a Photograph.

- 2) The duly filled in application shall be downloaded and copies of all documents as given in e-pass shall be attached to the Application and submitted to the School Head Master.
- 3) Each student must give a declaration that he is not in receipt of any stipend/ scholarship from State Government or Central Government.
- 4) The Head Master of the School shall verify all the details of the application and countersign the application. He shall also certify that the Student is not receiving any other Scholarship from the State or the Central Government.
- 5) All the applications of the Students shall be forwarded to the local Hostel Warden of the Tribal Welfare Department.
- 6) The Hostel Welfare Officer in whose jurisdiction the school is located shall be the verification officer for all students applications received from the school under the Scheme.
- 7) Verification of the Students by the Hostel Welfare Officer shall be done by authenticating the fingerprint of the Student with the UIDA online. For this purpose, the Hostel Welfare Officer shall first assess the "Best Finger Detection" (BFD) for online authentication and use such finger with the BFD for online authentication with the Aadhar network (UIDA).
- 8) Scholarship applications of only such students who have been authenticated online shall be processed for scholarship. Therefore Hostel Welfare Officer's and Head Masters are requested to ensure that the Aadhar number is entered correctly.
- 9) The Deputy Director (TW)/District Tribal Welfare Officers of the District shall process only the Online Authenticated applications for payment of Pre-Matric Scholarships.

4. The Commissioner, Tribal Welfare shall ensure that adequate steps are initiated to:

- a) Map all authorized schools / Hostels to Hostel Welfare Officers.
 - b) Impart training to Headmasters/Hostel Welfare Officers and Assistant Tribal Welfare Officers on the online system.
 - c) Ensure that all the Hostel Welfare Officers undertake Physical verification by the process of Online Authentication with UIDA
 - d) Ensure that all District Officers proactively co-ordinate with the concerned Departments for verification and sanction of pre-Matric Scholarships.
 - e) Ensure that the online system is put in place by the centre for Good Governance and has a full-fledged help line for assistance to users.
